## Flying with Coleman<sup>®</sup> Camping Appliances

Coleman<sup>®</sup> liquid-fuel and Coleman<sup>®</sup> pressurized fuel canisters (including 16.4 oz. propane cylinders, butane cylinders, and butane/propane mixture cylinders) <u>cannot</u> be transported on any commercial, passenger airliner.

For Coleman<sup>®</sup> fuel-burning appliances, all Coleman<sup>®</sup> liquid-fuel must be removed from appliance fuel tanks and all pressurized fuel canisters must be removed from the appliance before taking to the airport. Some carriers will not allow any previously used fuel-burning appliances to be transported. We recommend that you check with your airline prior to travelling to determine whether there are any restrictions on either checking or carrying-on either new or previously used appliances. In addition, any Coleman<sup>®</sup> fuel-burning appliance should be declared to the airline prior to transporting, whether in checked luggage or in carry-on luggage.
